## Our Vision is:

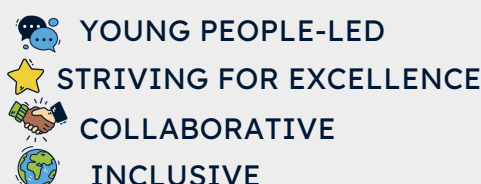
For a future where all young people are listened to, respected and supported

We say that young people's support should be:

### HOLISTIC

Support which addresses the 'whole person' is evidenced to be most effective and brings forward young people dealing with multiple challenges who may otherwise be left without support.

### Up to the AGE OF 25

Young people experiencing major life transitions such as changing schools, leaving care or leaving home need flexible, young people-focussed support up to the age of 25.

### Addressing HEALTH INEQUALITIES

Social disadvantage creates inequalities and barriers to accessing support. We are advocating for more flexible and responsive services, so that all young people get the help they need.
